

# COVID-19 Statistical Review

*Today's Analysis: Data from January 26, 2020*

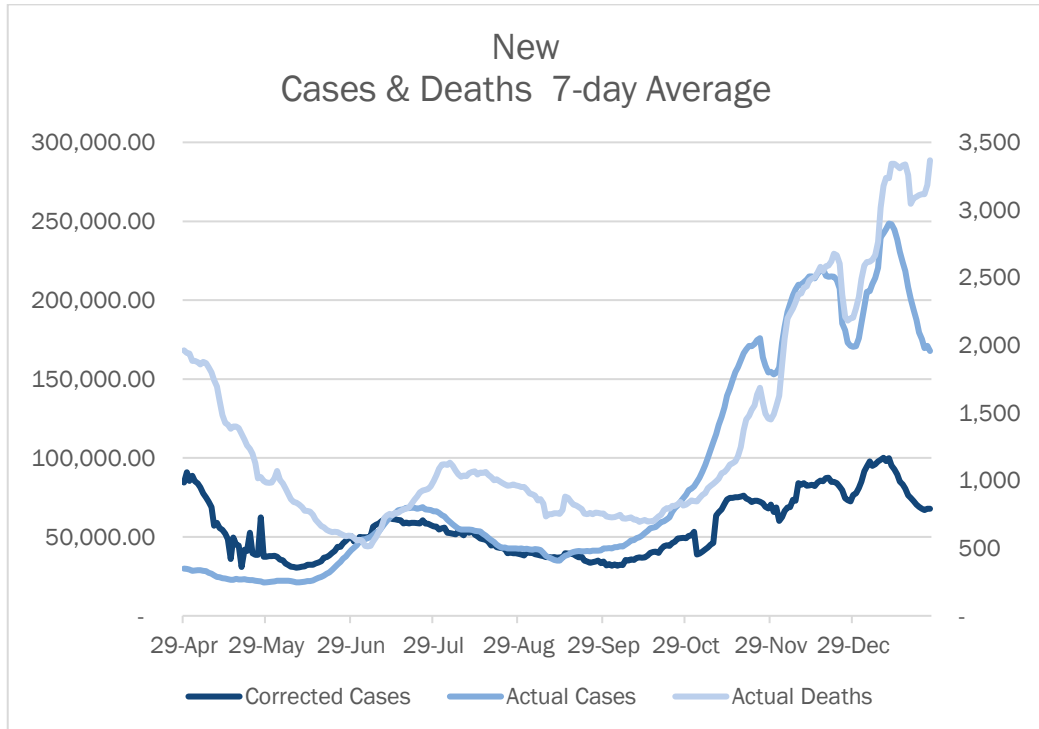
*Just two charts for today, Tuesday, but they tell the story. Cases resumed their fall, so the increase on Monday was an artifact of the MLK holiday.*

*In the same way, the second chart shows a sharp increase in deaths, as the pandemic has moved back to its previous trends after factoring out the MLK holiday effects. (See the arrows in the bottom chart.) As I have been saying, we have to wait patiently for deaths to begin reflecting the effects of the fall in cases, probably sometime around this weekend.*

*We are now above seven vaccine doses per hundred Americans. The current rate of increase would get a dose to every American in 220 days. Of course, the cure requires two doses. However, given the concentration of the problem in only a few population cohorts, we should be able to give two doses to the majority of vulnerable people within 60 days.*
